COVENANT KIDS CONGO

Because of the work of Covenant Kids Congo, **15,903 mothers/caregivers** with children newborn to 23 months have received nutrition counseling, learning proper food preparation and how to offer balanced meals to their families to prevent and treat malnutrition.

15,359 families have been educated on child protection and ways to report abuse, resulting in more cases reported to police and more perpetrators convicted.
